November 15, 2006 (Wednesday), 10:30-11:50 a.m. **IMPLEMENTATION OF THE LIVESTOCK FACILITY SITING LAW (#1744-1)** – As of November 1, 2006, local governments must incorporate state standards into their existing ordinances if they desire to continue to issue conditional use permits for new and expanded livestock facilities. Local governments that do not now require such permits may adopt an ordinance to do so at any time, as long as the new ordinances are consistent with state law and use the applicable state standards. This program will cover an overview of the law, local options for regulation and implementation of the state standards, pitfalls to avoid in ordinances, and local and state roles. *Moderated by Jim Schneider, Local Government Center; presented by Rick Stadelman, director, Wisconsin Towns Association; and Richard Castelnovo and Mike Murray, Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection staff.*

December 20, 2006 (Wednesday), 10:30-11:50 a.m. **IMPACT FEES AND OTHER METHODS OF FUNDING LOCAL PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS (#1744-2)** – Recent changes to the state's impact fee law by the Wisconsin Legislature have caused many local governments around the state to reexamine how they fund improvements for roads, parks, recreational trails, and other public improvements. This session will provide an overview of the current state of impact fees in Wisconsin and explore the interplay of impact fees with other community development tools such as special assessments, subdivision dedication requirements, and fees in lieu of dedication. *Moderated by Jim Schneider, Local Government Center; presented by Brian Ohm, Department of Urban and Regional Planning, UW-Madison, and other speaker(s) to be announced.*

January 31, 2007 (Wednesday), 10:30-11:50 a.m. **PLAN COMMISSION AND BOA MEMBERS AS LOCAL OFFICIALS (#1744-3)** – This program for staff and members of local plan commissions, county planning and zoning committees and zoning boards of appeal/adjustment covers aspects of the open meetings law, ethics and conflicts of interest laws, and concepts of fairness in decision-making. *Presented by Jim Schneider, J.D., Local Government Center; comments by Brian Ohm, J.D., Department of Urban and Regional Planning, UW-Extension, Madison.*

February 28, 2007 (Wednesday), 10:30-11:50 a.m. **THE WISCONSIN WORKING LANDS INITIATIVE (#1744-4)** – In 2005, Rod Nilsestuen, secretary of the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP), established this initiative to study policy options for the preservation of Wisconsin's agricultural and forested lands. In August, 2006, the Initiative's Steering Committee issued its report, which included recommendations to:

- improve the Farmland Preservation Program
- create programs to address the conversion of farmland
- create programs for beginning farmers and loggers
- promote opportunities to use land more efficiently
- create a new outreach program, and
- promote agricultural entrepreneurship and regional initiatives.

This program will discuss the Steering Committee's report, reactions to it, and proposals to implement its recommendations.

March 28, 2007 (Wednesday), 10:30-11:50 a.m. **RECENT CASE LAW (#1744-5)** – This program will highlight recent Wisconsin cases and attorney general opinions, as well as important federal cases, relating to land use planning and implementation. *Moderated by Jim Schneider, Local Government Center; presented by Richard K. Nordeng and Christopher B. Hughes, attorneys at Stafford Rosenbaum, LLP, Madison.*

April 18, 2007 (Wednesday), 10:30-11:50 a.m. **GROWING COMMUNITIES, GREENING COMMUNITIES: GREEN TIER – SUPPORTING BUSINESS FOR LOCAL ECONOMIC AND ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENT (#1744-6)** – Wisconsin's Green Tier program recognizes businesses and governmental units aspiring to differentiate themselves by systematically delivering superior environmental performance. Green Tier is a law that gives DNR the ability to treat superior performing companies and local governmental units differently through the use of contracts and charters. This session will explore early program outcomes, how parties are coming together to create innovative approaches, and will present examples of local environmental and economic potential under this program. *Moderated by Elaine Andrews, UW-Extension Environmental Resources Center; presented by Mark McDermid, Director, Cooperative Environmental Assistance Bureau, Wisconsin Department of Revenue; and John Kisiel, Wisconsin Builder's Association, Director of Development Council.*
